## Online abstract submission rules

### Copyright

Copyright of the abstract submission is assigned to the EMUC and ESUI Congress Office and any conflicts with any other scientific association will be the sole responsibility of the author(s).

### Topics

EMUC21 topics consists of prostate cancer, bladder cancer, renal cell carcinoma, testicular cancer or penile cancer topics. In case you wish to submit an abstract with an imaging topic, please return to [this page](#) and submit your abstract under "ESUI21".

### Size

The submission programme will automatically calculate the size of your abstract and will not allow submissions that do not fit the size requirements. The size of the abstract is limited to 3,000 characters (this includes title, body of abstract, spaces, tables and graphics). Every picture/graphic counts for 500 characters.

### Title

The title should clearly define the topic. Do not identify your institution in the title. There is no maximum length for the title. However, the characters in the title will count toward your total character count.

The first letter of the title will automatically begin with a capital letter. Use lower case letters, except for abbreviations. Do not type the entire title in capital letters.

### Authorship

Each quoted author should have contributed substantially to the represented work in terms of conceptual design or analysis, writing of the article and final approval of the article in order to take public responsibility for the content. Type full last name and first name of all authors, omitting any titles, degrees and institutional affiliations. During the upload procedure, you can submit who the presenting author will be, and this information can also be edited afterwards.

### Affiliation

Type the name of the Institution, Department, City and Country. If co-authors are from the same institution, you can select the option to automatically copy all information into the next boxes, so that you do not have to retype all information. If co-authors are not from the same institution you can edit each box accordingly. Please make sure that the institution, department and city are written in English. The system allows authors to have only one affiliation, so in case someone works in different institutions, please indicate the main work place.

### Body of the abstract

State the objective of the study, describe the material and methods, summarize the results presenting sufficient details to support the conclusions reached (it is not acceptable to state: "The results will be discussed"). Use numbers for numbers and only very common abbreviations e.g., ml, kg, MRI... If you must use other abbreviations, you must explain the first time it appears.

The following headings have already been formatted for you and should not be entered in the text fields again:

- Introduction & objectives
- Materials & methods
- Results
- Conclusion

### **Proofreading**

Verify that your abstract is correct and read the proof carefully. At step 6, you will get a preview of your abstract which you can printout directly. Keep this print out for your own records.

### **Editing**

Abstract bodies will be published as submitted, except for a simple English spelling check. You will be able to edit your abstract until the submission deadline. After the submission deadline there is no possibility to edit the submission text anymore.

### **Submission deadline**

Deadline for abstract submission is 1 September 2021, 23:59:59 CET. To avoid that your abstract cannot be submitted due to technical difficulties, computer problems or other reasons, you are advised to submit your abstract on time.

### **Notification**

The abstracts will be anonymously reviewed by the reviewing committee. The outcome of the abstract selection will be available online through the abstract submission website. You will receive a notification by email indicating the exact date.

### **Trial in Progress abstracts**

Feel free to submit trial in progress abstracts, as these are allowed by the EMUC and ESUI Congress office. The trial needs to be ongoing, ie: the first patient should already been recruited.

### **Encore abstracts**

Encore abstracts are only accepted if the data significantly changed; e.g. larger patient database.

### **Please do not forget**

- Only abstracts submitted through the official online submission system will be considered.
- Cancellation, withdrawal or name changes should be notified 2 months prior to the congress by email to [emuc@congressconsultants.com](mailto:emuc@congressconsultants.com) or [esui@congressconsultants.com](mailto:esui@congressconsultants.com)
- Abstracts must be submitted in English. This applies also to the title, text body and author affiliations.
- Authors may submit more than one abstract but are asked to exercise reasonable restraint.
- You are allowed to submit abstracts that have been submitted for other meetings as well, but only if they have not been accepted during previous EMUC meetings. The review committee will decide whether the abstract is still interesting enough to be accepted for EMUC.
